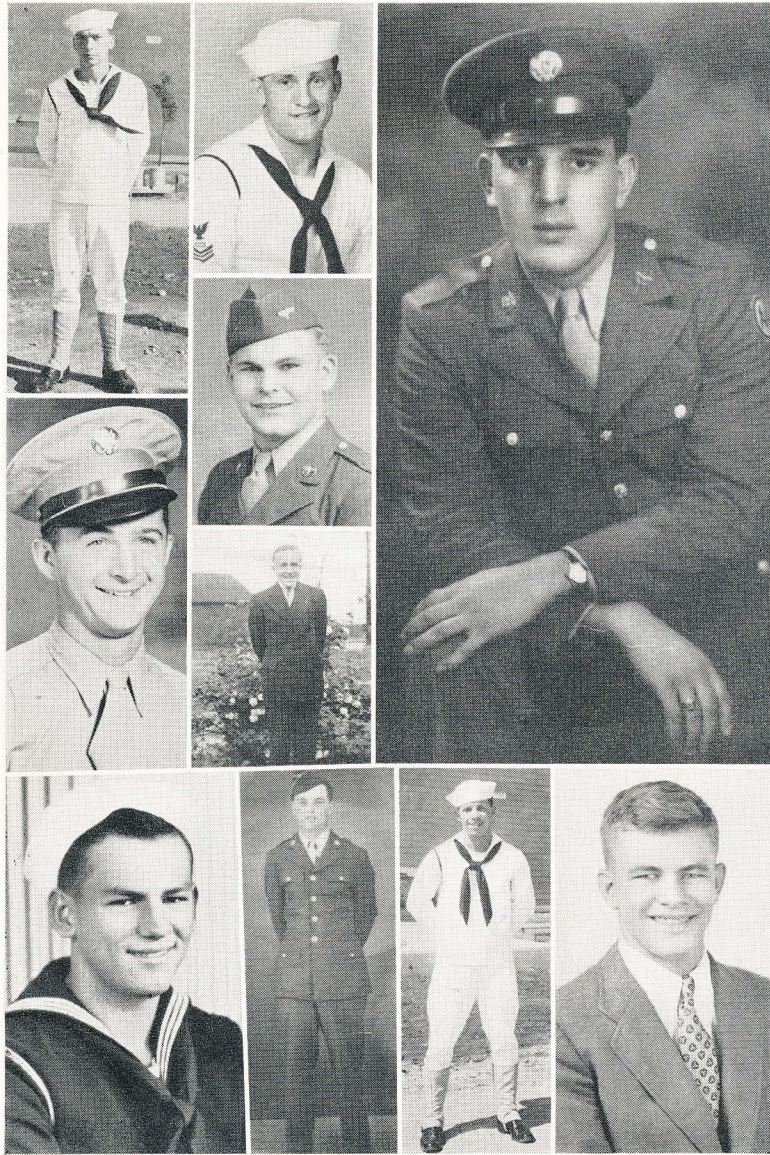
DEDICATION
