WILL OF ELIZABETH McCracken

I, Elizabeth McCracken, a resident of Cameron District, Marshall County, and State of West Virginia, being of sound mind and disposing memory, and realizing the uncertainty of this mortal life. And the certainty of death. Do make this my last will and testament. Hereby revoking any will or wills, by me heretofore made as null and void.

First. To my daughter Rebecca Scott, I give and bequeath, a certain parcel of land, situated in Cameron District, Marshall County, West Virginia, containing two acres be the same more or less, and being the same property conveyed to me by George McVey and wife in September A. D. 1911, and further I direct the said Rebecca Scott shall pay unto my daughters viz. Della Huffner, One Hundred Dollars (\$100) Caddie Grimes, One Hundred Dollars (\$100) and unto my Grand Daughter Gay Ruten Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) said payments so directed to be paid within Eighteen months after my death.

Second. To my daughter Mary Hughes, I give and bequeath a certain parcel of land situated in Cameron District, Marshall County, West Virginia, containing one acre be the same more or less, being and known as the Edward Anderson property and being the same property as conveyed to me in January, 1905, I also, give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Hughes the Organ in my home.

Third. To my daughter's Della Huffner, and Caddie Grimes I give and bequeath a certain parcel of land, situated in Cameron District, Marshall County, West Virginia, and being the same property as conveyed to me by Abraham Miller and wife, they to share and share alike in said property.

Fourth. To my son John H. McCracken I give and bequeath to him the sum of One Hundred Dollars in cash and the note I held against him for Sixty Dollars together with the interest the same to be delivered and paid within Eighteen months from my death.

Fifth. To my Grand Daughter Gay Ruten I give and bequeath my Cow, the only one I own, and also her picture, the said Cow and picture to be delivered by my Executor as soon as convenient after my death.

Six. To my daughter Caddie Grimes, I give and bequeath the picture of her Father.

Seventh. I give and bequeath to my five children viz. Della Huffner, Caddie Grimes, Mary Hughes, Rebecca Scott, and John H. McCracken All my household effects and other personal property that I may be possessed at my death to be divided

equal share and share alike after all my debts and funeral expenses are paid.
