Will of Isaac McCracken

Canron, West Virginia August 4, 1903.

I, Isaac McCracken, being the advanced
age and the certainty of death, desir-
ing to dispose of my earthly goods as
best I see fit, I hereby revoke all former wills by me made
and make this as my last true will
and testament viz:

I hereby will bequeath and devise all
my property both personal and real to
my son John D. McCracken. I further will
that my son John D. McCracken shall
pay to each of my four daughters, namely
Lola Bell Sufferer, Mary A. Hughes, Rosetta
Scott and Caddy P. McCracken the hundred
and sixty dollars and to my grand
daughter Gay McCracken one hundred
dollars, and to each of my three young-
est daughters and to my grand daugh-
ter Gay McCracken a two year old
heifer, my eldest daughter Lola B.

having already received a Colt in
 lieu of a heifer, and I further wish that
 my daughter Caddy P. Cracker and
 said grand daughter Jan. M. Cracker is
 to have a setting out of house hold goods
 such as my other daughters, that are
 now married received from me. I
 further request that my daughter Leida
 J. Huffer shall give ten dollars of
 the money I will give to my granddaugh-
 ter Firo Huffer and that my daugh-
 ter Mary A. Huffer pay ten dollars of
 the money I will give to my grand
 daughter, and that my daughter
 Rebecca Scott pay to my grand daughter
 Eva Scott ten dollars of the money I
 will give her.

All of the above named sums of money
 ought to be paid by my son John A. Cracker.

Above said money is to be paid within
 five years from the date of my death,
 and the heirs and the pittinge out
 are such as they are needed after mar-
 riage, I further wish that all my
 just debts be paid by my son John
 A. Cracker as soon as convenient
 after my death.

And I hereby give to my beloved wife
 that in lands of West Virginia in justice
 and my own witness I hereby
 hereby at my hand and seal
 Isaac K. Cracker.
