Last Will and Testament of Jacob Cornell Deceased Will Book 1 Page 114

In the name of God Amen. The tenth day of March 1829 I Jacob Cornell of the county of Tyler and State of Virginia being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the power of God and as touching the worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and for in Inprimis I give and bequeath to Drusilla my dearly beloved wife the whole of my real estate together with all my household goods Debts and other moveable effects so long as she remains my widow but if she should marry again or at her death the whole to be sold and divided equally among all my children My son William and John Bullman I likewise constitute make and ordain my sole executors of this my last will and testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannull all and every other former testaments will legacies and bequests and executors by me in any ways before named willed and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament In writings whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written Jacob Cornell
