

JOHN P. DOUGHERTY (also DAUGHERTY)

Company "H" 11th West Virginia Infantry

Died of 'Brain Fever' in U. S. Hospital Parkersburg, W.Va. Sept. 30, 1862.

During the Civil War, men over the age of 45 were considered too old to serve. So, just as some young boys overstated their age in order to enlist, some old men understated their age.

JOHN P. DOUGHERTY *greatly* understated his age. He was born about 1800, according to census records. Another man in this same company, GEORGE W. BLAKE, born about 1796, was also determined to serve, and he, too, died during service.

John P. Dougherty's stated age 44 when he joined for duty, enrolled and mustered in at Bellton on Sept. 30, 1861.

This man is found in the Draft Registration record, dated 1863, as "John P. Dougherty." A government headstone was provided for him as "John P. Dougherty," with the death date Sept. 30, 1862. He is buried at Greenfield Ridge Cemetery, Marshall County.

John P. Dougherty married Catherine Brannon on April 17, 1823 in Ohio County. He was 50 years old in the 1850 census of Marshall County:

John W. Dougherty, the son of the deceased man, served in the same company and the two are sometimes confused. John W. was discharged in 1862 for disability after he accidentally shot himself in the hand. He re-enlisted in 1864 and served as a Wagoner in Co. A 17 W.Va. Inf. His name was spelled "Daugherty" in the records for that service.

The following widow's pension confirms the information. A daughter also applied for a pension and her info is included in the file.

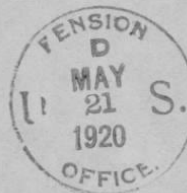

Acknowledging receipt of your communication and that of Mrs. Laura Bogard, 327 8th Street, Moundsville, West Virginia, in which inquiry is made relative to any back pension which might be due on account of the service of her father, John P. Dougherty, Company H, 11th Virginia Volunteers, I have the honor to advise you that all pension due on account of said soldier's service was paid his widow, Mrs. Catherine Dougherty, during her lifetime, under certificate number 95032. Her pension was made to commence from September 30, 1862, date of soldier's death, and terminated December 4, 1889, because of her death. There is therefore no back pension of any nature due.

State of West Virginia County of Marshall S.S.

This 17th day of April 1867 personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace in and for the County of State aforesaid Ben. W. Parriott who being duly sworn according to law declares that he was late a Captain of Co H 11th Regt W Va Infantry. That John D. Dougherty was a private of said Company that he was acquainted with said Dougherty before he enlisted which was on or about the 30th day of September 1861 that his health was good at the time ^{of enlistment} and remained good until he was taken sick of the disease of which he died that he was on duty as company cook at the time he was taken sick that he was taken suddenly & violently as supposed of brain fever being speechless when taken from the Regiment to the Hospital at Parkersburg W Va where he soon died. That he was a man of Temperate and steady habits both before and after his enlistment. That at the time he was taken sick his company was detached from the Regiment and was doing duty in Parkersburg that there was no surgeon with the detachment therefore the certificate of one cannot be had in this case that the age of the said John D. Dougherty stands recorded on the rolls of his company as (47) forty seven years when enlisted. That his knowledge of the facts is derived from being personally present and being a commissioned officer of the Company at the time the circumstances happened and he further declares that he has no interest
