Samuel A. Parriott, born December 23, 1838, was the son of Joseph S. Parriott and Hannah Vandiver. Joseph was the son of the Christopher Parriott who came from England and later joined the colonists to serve in the Revolutionary War for Independence.

The siblings of Samuel A. Parriott were Dennis, Mary Amelia, Mary Elizabeth, William E., Mathilda E., George "Wilson", Mary Belle, and Sarah Drucilla.

At the outset of the Civil War, Samuel A. Parriott served in the Marshall County Home Guards. He was commissioned Lieutenant in the West Virginia Militia on July 8, 1862, to rank from 24 May 1862.

In 1863, Samuel, a farmhand, enlisted for 6 months in Company "L" 4th W. Va. Cavalry. In 1864, he enlisted for another year and served as a First Lieutenant in Company "A" 17th W. Va. Infantry.

Following the war, Samuel married Flora McDonald on January 12, 1869 in Marshall County. They made their home in Cameron where Samuel operated a hotel.

The children of Samuel and Flora were Franklin, Fredonia, William, Anna V. and Alta Gertrude.

Samuel died December 4, 1906 and is buried at Cameron Cemetery.
