

DAVID ALEXANDER (DAVID A. L.) SIVERT

1st Sergeant, Company "A" 3<sup>rd</sup> West Virginia Cavalry

At age 31, David Alexander Sivert enrolled in Capt. Conger's Company, 3<sup>rd</sup> Regiment (West) Virginia Cavalry on October 8, 1861 at Wheeling. He mustered in on December 23, 1861 at Camp Carlisle and had the rank of 2<sup>nd</sup> Sergeant. He re-enlisted on February 5, 1864 to serve another 3 years.

At the Battle of Winchester on September 19, 1864, he was shot. The bullet "entered the right breast between the 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> ribs near the nipple and entering the pleural cavity passed out between the same ribs near the spine." He was in the hospital at Wheeling and was subsequently unable to do duty. A disability discharge was authorized on June 7, 1865, at which time the war was essentially over.

COMPLETE SERVICE RECORD FOLLOWING RE-ENLISTMENT

Born in Cameron, Marshall County, (West) Virginia on August 19, 1847, the soldier was the son of Jacob Sivert, Sr. and Mary Jane Mara/Morrow. He married Sarah Margaret Adams and known children were: Maria/Mariah Jane, Jacob F., Henry B., and Ella Delora.

He leaves his wife, Sarah M.; one son, Jacob Sivert, of Manchester, O.; one daughter, Mrs. Janey Finnegan of Akron, and four sisters. Funeral services from the home, Sunday, 4:30 p. m., Rev. W. E. Troup officiating. Burial in Cameron, W. Va., Monday. (The Campfield-Hickman Co.)

The daughter mentioned in the obituary was probably Maria Jane. She married Robert E. Finegan and they lived in Akron, Summit County, Ohio. She died in 1938 in Summit County and is buried there.
