# U. S. Army Private, Company "D" 111th Infantry, 28th Division

### Fell From Billet and Died on January 25, 1919 in France

TWO Marshall County men named John Gray died during World War I. This man is honored on the Marshall County Service Dead Memorial at the courthouse in Moundsville. John Wilford Gray is not.

**JOHN L. GRAY** - U. S. Army, Private, Company D 111th Infantry, 28th Division. Death notice in Moundsville *Echo* states, "Killed in France on January 25, 1919 after falling from his billet." The same is reported in the West Virginia Adjutant General's *Revised List of Deceased Soldiers, World War*, January 1, 1922. He is buried at Mt. Rose Cemetery, Moundsville. In his WWI Draft Registration, he stated he was born on April 19, 1891 in Marshall County. He lived at 211 Tomlinson Avenue, Moundsville, and was employed as a laborer at Fostoria Glass Company. His parents were William Gray and Jennie Boston, residents of Moundsville in the 1910 census with children, Ella, Celia, John and George.

A telegram was recuived by his mother, Mrs. Jennie Gray of 21 Tomlinson avenue stating that he fell from his billet January 25 and austained injuries which caused his death. He left here in May for Camp Lee and had been in France several months. Before leaving to join the army he was employed at the Fostoria glass factory. Jiesides his mother, one brother and two sisters survive.
