When Albert registered for the World War I Draft, he stated his middle name as Robert. On his obituary, the middle name is Redman, his mother's maiden name. The name was Redman at birth.

Like a holt from the clear sky came the announcement of the untimely death at camp Mills, Miniota, N. Y., of Harry Redman Bachman, only son of Harry E, and Lillie D. Bachman of 2026 Jacob street, this city, following a brief illness. He was one of the most popular young men of the city and was booked to sail from New York city for France the day that he passed away. His mother had gone to hid him good-by, but little did she think that it was to be forever.

He was born and reared in this city and attended and graduated from the public schools of this city, and later from the high school, following which he attended the West Virginia university at Morgantown. He enlisted in the army and was sent to Fort Oglethorpe, Ga., where he was stationed for some time in the medical supply division and later was transferred to Boston, Mass., where he remained until transferred to Camp Mills. He was in the 22nd year of his age, and is survived by one sister. Mrs. Niles Rad-cliffe of this city, whose husband is also in the army, being stationed at Fort Leavenworth, Kan., in the radio service. His father and mother also survive. The father and mother are at New York and 'are expected to arrive with the remains today, following which they will be taken to the family residence, from which place interment will be made.
