Frank R. Browning, born on November 30, 1892 in Belpre, Washington County, Ohio, was the son of John Dana Browning and Mary Ryan. They are found in Belpre in the 1910 census residing on Blennerhassett Avenue. "Dana J." Browning, the father, was a farmer, and his wife, Mary, had given birth to 6 children, with 4 still living. The children were Laura N., 25, Louise M., 22, Julia M., 20, and Frank R., 18.

When Frank registered for the World War I Draft, he was working in Wheeling, Ohio County, West Virginia as a potter for Ed Marshall.
