U. S. Army Sergeant, Company "E" 314th Field Artillery

Fell from Horse and Died of Injuries November 17, 1918 at Camp Lee, Virginia

The son of Lincoln Chalker and Myrtle Poole, William was born on November 16, 1893 at Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania.

In 1900, Lincoln and Myrtle Chalker lived in South Huntingdon Township, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania. In 1910, they lived in York Township, Tuscarawas County, Ohio. In both records, William H. was their only child.

In 1913, Lincoln Chalker was named in the Wheeling City Directory at 156 – 16th Street, employed as a Carpenter.

When William registered for the World War I Draft, he stated his address as 156 – 16th Street, Wheeling, and he was employed as a coal mine foreman for the Pittsburgh and Cleveland Coal Company.



Local friends were grieved to learn of the death of Sergeant William Chalker, son of Mr. and Mrs. O L. Chalker, of 156 Sixteenth street, which occurred Sunday morning at the base hospital at Camp Lee, Va., Some time ago Sergeant Chalker was seriously injured when haten from a hurse in camp. He was cost fined to the Maximum two months was was thought to be recuperating, when it was found necessary for him to return to the hospital, resulting in his death Sunday.

The body is expected to arrive to-day. and although arrangements for the funeral have not been completed, interment will be made in Trumbull County, Ohio.

Sergeant Chalker was well known and popular among a wide circle of friends. He was especially prominent among the miners of Belmont county, and was formerly foreman of the Gaylord mine of the Y. & O. company near Martins Ferry having left this work to depart with Wheeling's first contingent to enter training at Camp Lee.
