Clyde Damsel, born on November 6, 1888, was the son of Edward Long Damsel and Mary "Mollie" Holton, married in Belmont County, Ohio on January 27, 1889.

At the time of the 1900 census of Wheeling, Ohio County, West Virginia, Edward L. and Mary Damsel lived on McCulloch with their children, Katherine, Charles, Clyde and Marie. In 1910, they lived on 11th Street, Wheeling and the children at home were Clyde, Marie and Dorothy. Clyde, 19, was a Glass Blower at a Glass House.

Clyde Damsel was unmarried when he registered for the World War I Draft, but according to his obituary, he married Virginia Scott before he left to serve in the Navy.
