U. S. Army Private, 380th Tank Corps Died of Influenza on September 29, 1918 at Camp Colt, near Gettysburg, Pennsylvania



Born on August 19, 1896, Thurston was the son of John A. Hughes and Minnie B. Winam, found in Washington District, Wheeling, in the 1900 census. Mr. Hughes was employed as a Cigar Maker. The children were stated as Alfred T. [Thurston], born in August 1896, and John S., born in July 1898.

In the 1910 census, the family lived at Pike Street, Wheeling, and the father worked at a Stogie Factory. The children were Thurston A., Stanley J., and Thelma. In 1915, Thurston was employed as a Stogiemaker, according to the Wheeling City Directory.

Thurston married Carrie Mae Rider from Benwood on December 17, 1917

The remains of the late Thurston A. Hughes, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Hughes, of near Elm Grove, who passed away on Saturday evening at 9 o'clock at the base hospital at c'amp c'olt, near Gettysburg. I'm, where he was in training, are expected to arrive today at 12 (noon) over the Fennsylvania lines, and will be taken immediately to the family home, where they will remain until the funeral, which will be announced later.

The deceased was in the twenty-second year of his age and was for a time the out-the-pike reporter on the Wheeling Intelligencer. He resided for a time in North Wheeling; and is well known throughout the local district, where he has a host of friends. He enlisted and was sent to Richmond, Va., where he was in training for some time, and a short time ago was transferred to Camp Colt.

A short time before collisting he was united in marriage to Miss Carrie Rider. a well known school teacher of Benwood. Besides his parents and widow, he is survived by one brother, Stanley Hughes, at home.

Thurston's cause of death was Influenza & Broncho-pneumonia. The location was Cumberland, Adams County, Pennsylvania, according to his Pennsylvania Death Record. He is buried at Greenwood Cemetery, Wheeling.
