In action while fighting for world democracy on the battlefields of France.

He was one of the first auto mechanics in the out-the-pike district and for a number of years was employed by John L. Kirkland at his garage at Woodsdale. He went to Cleveland, Ohio, and from that place entered the service of Uncle Sam and was sent early in the war to the front line trenches, and during the week preceding the signing of the armistice he was killed.

Anthony Kane was born in Newport, Campbell County, Kentucky, on December 26, 1887. His parents, John Kane and Mary Elizabeth Schlosser, were married in Newport on August 9, 1886. The fate of John Kane is not known.

The 1900 census of Washington District, Ohio County, West Virginia, finds Girt and Lizzie Edwards and children, Henry L., born May 1886, Adrew, born December 1897 and Julia, born September 1891. "Adrew" is obviously Anthony. All were born in Kentucky. In 1910, they still resided in Washington District, "National Road North Side" and Girt's step-children at home were Julia, 18, and Antoni, 22, an Automobile Chauffer.

Henry Kane, 22, born in Newport, Kentucky, residing in Fulton, Elm Grove, had married Grace Black in 1908.

In 1912, Julia married Daniel H. Bowman and they later divorced. In 1936, in Wheeling, Julia married William F. Folmar.

Elizabeth Kane didn't actually marry Girt Edwards until November 29, 1919 (Brooke County), and he died in 1927. Mrs. Edwards died October 10, 1952 and she is buried at Stone Church Cemetery, as is her late husband, Girt. Her burial record states her name as Marie Elizabeth Schlosser Edwards.

Henry Louis Kane, born May 31, 1886, died June 12, 1938. Julia Ann Kane Folmar, born on September 27, 1891, died May 23, 1965. Both are buried at Stone Church Cemetery.

Mrs. Elizabeth Kane, RD #4, Box 108, Elm Grove, Wheeling, West Virginia is named as one of the Gold Star Mothers contacted about a Pilgrimage to France. She opted not to go.
