

CLYDE STANLEY KELLEY

U. S. Army Sergeant, 326th Field Signal Battalion

Clyde Stanley Kelley is named in an old newspaper article as one who died during World War I. He served honorably in the army and was discharged. His death occurred as a result of a Mediastinal Sarcoma, according to his death record.

Clyde was born on January 6, 1891 at Silver Hill, Wetzel County, West Virginia. His parents were Alonzo N. Kelley, a farmer, and Martha Pyles. At the time of the 1900 census, the family lived in Proctor, Wetzel County. The parents had been married for 10 years and Mrs. Kelley had given birth to 5 children, all living. The 4 children named in the census were Clyde S., 9, Ivan D., 7, Brice D., 5, and Doyle D., 5 months. By 1910, they lived on Wayman's Ridge Road, Marshall County and the number of children Mrs. Kelly had given birth to was stated as 4. All four children were at home.

At the time he registered for the World War I Draft, Clyde was living on Jacob Street, Wheeling, and he was employed at Jebbia & Metz Produce Dealers.

Clyde S. Kelly.

Clyde S Kelly, aged 29 years, died yesterday morning at the Ohio Valley General hospital, following an extended illness. He was the son of Alonzo Kelly, of Limestone, Marshall county, but had resided in this city for several years. He made his home at No. 80 Sixteenth street and was employed by the Jobbia & Metz Wholesale Produce Company.

The deceased was a veteran of the World War, having served two years with the American Expeditionary Forces in France, and with the army of occupation. He suffered an attack of influenza last year and never fully recovered from the effects. For several years he has been suffering with heart trouble, which caused his death.

Funeral arrangements are incomplete, but it is thought that the remains will be sent to his father's home at Limestone, where interment will be made.

Buried at Limestone Cemetery, Marshall County.
