

# JOSEPH ANDREW MARSHALL

U. S. Army Private, 301 Water Tank Battalion

Died of Pneumonia on October 8, 1918 While En Route to France

Born in Fulton, Wheeling, West Virginia, on February 20, 1895, Joseph Andrew Marshall was the son of Andrew Jackson Marshall and Sarah Porter. The family was living on National Road, Fulton, at the time of the 1900 census, at which time Mr. Marshall worked as a Teamster. The Marshall children were James, 14, Effel [Ethel], 12, Joseph A., and Harry A. By 1910, there were two more daughters, Florence E., and Hazel S.

When Joseph registered for the World War I Draft, he was employed as a Farm Laborer.

## BODIES OF TWO WORLD WAR VETS BEING SENT HOME

The bodies of two veterans of the World war, Paul Norrington and Joseph Marshall, who gave their lives overseas in the late conflict, are now being shipped to their relatives in the Wheeling district. The remains of both are expected to arrive momentarily since they have already reached this country.

The former is the son of Mr and Mrs. Frank Norrington of Moundsville. He was a sailor aboard the torpedoed Otranto, and lost his life when that ship was attacked. His body was recovered and buried in England from where it was brought to New York. It is now on its way to the parents of the deceased in Moundsville, and will be buried with fitting honors upon its arrival.

Joseph Marshall was the son of Mr and Mrs. Andrew Marshall of Fulton. His death occurred in England while he was enroute to France. He had been stationed in Camp Meade while in training. The funeral of the late soldier will be held immediately upon the arrival of his body in Wheeling.

Buried at Stone Church Cemetery, Elm Grove.

# A. J. MARSHALL, FULTON, DIES

69-YEAR-OLD LIFE RESIDENT  
OF FULTON SUGCUMBS  
AFTER TWO WEEKS'  
ILLNESS

Andrew Jackson Marshall, 69, life resident of Fulton, died Wednesday evening at 9:45 o'clock at his home, 207 National road, Fulton, after a two weeks' illness. He suffered a sunstroke three years ago, to which his death was indirectly attributed.

Mr. Marshall was born at the house in which he died on March 4, 1865, the son of James and Elizabeth Grobes Marshall, pioneer residents of Ohio county. He was educated in the public schools and for a number of years was employed with Roth Brothers, Fulton. He retired three years ago because of ill health suffered after he sustained a sunstroke.

He was a Methodist by faith.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Sarah Ann Porter Marshall; three daughters, Mrs. Andrew Hahn, Mrs. Florence Ogden and Miss Hazel Marshall, all of Wheeling; two sons, James Marshall, of Clinton and Harry Allen Marshall, Wheeling; one sister, Miss Ucretia Marshall, Wheeling and nine grandchildren.

The body has been removed to the Altmeyer and Sons funeral home, and will be removed to the home of his sister, 209 National road, this afternoon. Funeral services probably will be held from her home Sunday afternoon. Arrangements are incomplete.
