

CHARLES HOGG QUARRIER

U. S. Army Private 1st Class, Battery "D" 314th Field Artillery

Died of Heart Disease at Sea on March 19, 1919, While On His Way Home From War

Born on December 14, 1892, Charles Quarrier was the son of Hullihen Quarrier and his second wife, Anne Grayson Hogg. The family is found in the 1900 census residing in Triadelphia District, Ohio County. Mr. Quarrier was a Dry Goods Merchant. Children at home were Charles H., 7, and H., 4. In 1910, at Kenwood Place, Triadelphia, Charles H., and his brother, Hullihen D. The father, Hullihen Quarrier, died in Wheeling on February 5, 1919. Two months later, Charles died at sea while on his way home from war.

YOUNG QUARRIER DROPPED DEAD ON DECK OF TRANSPORT WHILE TALKING WITH SOLDIER FRIENDS

NEW YORK, April 4.—Private Charles Quarrier, of Wheeling, W. Va., died at sea on board the transport Roma on March 19, it was learned when that vessel, bringing 875 officers and men, mainly of casual companies, docked today in Brooklyn. His death was caused by heart disease and was very sudden.

The Roma left Marseilles on March 15 and put in at Gibraltar to coal and stayed there several days. Private Quarrier appeared in good health, and with other troops on board the ship obtained shore leave and spent some time in Gibraltar.

The day after the Roma resumed her voyage across the ocean he was taken suddenly ill and expired within a few minutes, although the ship's surgeon exerted every effort to save him.

What brought on the heart attack is problematical. At the time Quarrier was standing conversing with several other men, and dropped to the deck, his death being almost instantaneous.

The body was brought back and will be shipped to Wheeling.

QUARRIER FUNERAL THIS AFTERNOON

Remains of the Late Charles H. Quarrier to Be Laid to Rest in Mausoleum at Greenwood.

Funeral services for the late Charles H. Quarrier popular and well known young man of Woodsdale, who passed away on the S. S. Roma while on his way home from the battlefields of France where he had taken part in many of the big engagements that turned back the "Hun" will be held this afternoon at 5 o'clock from the residence of his mother, Mrs Anna H. Quarrier, Bethany pike. Rev R. E. L. Strider, pastor of the St. Matthew's P. E. church, of which the deceased was a member, will officiate. Burial will be in the mausoleum at Greenwood and will be private.

The remains arrived on the Pennsylvania at 12.20 Sunday (noon) accompanied by his aunt, Mrs J. H. Lynn, who went aboard the Roma upon docking at New York city. Through the assistance of U. S. Senator Warren G. Harding and other government officials she was accorded every aid in expediting matters in having the remains brought through. Mr Quarrier passed away very suddenly on the steamer a few days after it left Gibraltar, where he had been ashore. A number of his fellow companions aided in having the remains started home. The deceased was of a jovial disposition and a great favorite with all who knew him.

Entombed in the Mausoleum at Greenwood Cemetery, Wheeling.
