
Died of Heart Disease at Sea on March 19, 1919, While On His Way Home From War

Born on December 14, 1892, Charles Quarrier was the son of Hullihen Quarrier and his second wife, Anne Grayson Hogg. The family is found in the 1900 census residing in Triadelphia District, Ohio County. Mr. Quarrier was a Dry Goods Merchant. Children at home were Charles H., 7, and H., 4. In 1910, at Kenwood Place, Triadelphia, Charles H., and his brother, Hullihen D.
