HOWARD IRWIN RODGERS

U. S. Army Private, 19th Company, 155th Depot Brigade Died of Pneumonia at Camp Meade, Maryland, October 12, 1918

Howard Irwin Rodgers, born in Wheeling on August 4, 1896, was the son of John Rodgers and Anna Tuttle, married in Wheeling on February 5, 1891.

In the 1900 census of Liberty District, Ohio County, the family lived in West Liberty. The father was a Day Laborer and his wife had given birth to 5 children and four were living. The children in the home were Blanch M., 6, and Howard I., 3.

In 1910, the family lived on Clinton & Potomac Road, Liberty District, and John A. Rodgers was a farmer. Their children were Myrtle, 16, Howard I., 14, Jennie L., 9, and Arnold A., 4.

As indicated in Howard's World War I Draft Registration, he was living and working in Pittsburgh prior to his service in the U. S. Army.

Wheeling Intelligencer, 14 Oct 1918 Boney's Point Soldier. Private Howard L. Rodgers, of Roney's Point, died in Camp Meade, Md., Saturday, according to a message received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Rodgers. Death was due to pneumonia. Private Rodgers left with the contingent of soldiers in September for Camp Meade. Prior to his being inducted into the army he worked in a government plant at Pittsburgh, He was 22 years of age. He leaves besides his parents a brother and sister, Arnold and Miss Jennie Rodgers. Fuheral arrangements will be completed upon arrival of the body.

Buried at West Alexander Cemetery, Washington County, Pennsylvania.

The mother, Anna Tuttle Rodgers, died of a brain abscess in Wheeling in 1925. Her husband died in Wheeling in 1935. They are buried at West Alexander Cemetery.
