
Born in Wheeling on July 30, 1891, Vincent Jacob Stenger was the son of John Joseph Stenger and Mary Jane Myles, married in Wheeling on October 3, 1881. They were residents of Richland District, Ohio County, at the time of the 1900 census. Mr. Stenger, born in Ohio, and Mary J., born in West Virginia, were the parents of 6 children: Katherine, 19, William. 15, John J., 12, Vincent J., 8, Herbert M., 5, and Earl A., 2. By 1910, still in Ohio County, they resided on Riley & Delaplaine Road and Mr. Stenger was a Farmer. Another son, Raymond, born after the 1900 census, was 7 years old.

When Vincent registered for the World War I Draft, he was living in Short Creek in nearby Brooke county and he was employed as a farmer for W. S. Stenger.

Private Stenger is the son of Mr. and Mrs John J Stenger, of Short Creek. Young Stenger is one of the Warwood boys who left with the first contingent for Camp Lee, Va.

Vincent Jacob died in a military hospital in Winchester, Hampshire, England, He was initially buried there and then his remains were returned in 1920 and he was interred at Mt. Calvary, Wheeling.
