

CHARLES JOSEPH WATERHOUSE, JR.

U. S. Army Private, Clerk at Base Hospital 23

Died of Pneumonia on January 4, 1919; buried at Suresnes American Cemetery, France

Charles Joseph Waterhouse, Jr. was born in Wheeling on August 15, 1895 to Charles Waterhouse and Katherine Hallisy, married in Wheeling on June 1, 1893. The family is found in Triadelphia, Ohio County, in the 1900 census, and Mr. Waterhouse was employed as a Grocery Salesman. The children were John H., 6, Robert D., 4, Charles, Jr., 3, and Kenneth, 6 months. By 1910, still in Triadelphia, they had a daughter, Catherine/Katherine, age 6.

The birth date of Charles conflicts in the records. He enlisted in New York.
