## **GEORGE LEWIS YOCKEY**

## Private 16<sup>th</sup> Infantry, 1<sup>st</sup> Division

## Killed in Action October 10, 1918; buried at Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, France

George Lewis Yockey was born on August 31, 1889 at Wheeling, Ohio County, West Virginia. In the West Virginia Birth Records, his parents are listed as Carl and Maggie. Carl Yockey and Margaret "Maggie" Brost were married in Wheeling on October 7, 1884.

The surname is also found as YOCKE. Carl is also found as CHARLES.

Margaret (Brost) Yocke died October 30, 1897. She died of Puerperal Phlebitis, a complication of childbirth. She is buried at Mt. Wood Cemetery, Wheeling. Her address was 518 Market Street, per the Mt. Wood Cemetery book, compiled by Audra Wayne. An infant son, Eddie, died April 5, 1898, and he is buried in the same plot at Mt. Wood; address 519 Market Street. In her death record, Margaret's parents are stated as Michael and Margaret Brost.

In the 1900 census of Washington District, Wheeling, Charles Yaky, a widower, 38, born in Germany in June 1861, was residing at 519 Market Street. Living with him were his two sons, Charles, 14, born January 1886, and George, 10, born August 1889.

A known brother of George was Charles Michael Yockey, born January 29, 1886. In 1910, he was living with Josephine Brost in 1910 on Coal Street, Wheeling. He married Katherine Hanke in 1917. When he registered for the draft, he stated his birthdate as January 29, 1886, confirmed by his death certificate in 1941. His tombstone at Greenwood Cemetery has an incorrect birth year.

George's father, Charles Yockey, probably the Americanized version of Carl, born in Germany, was a widower in the 1910 census of Wheeling, and a resident of Coal Street. George was 21 in 1910 and was a boarder with Louis Hoffman, an Ice Merchant. George was employed as a laborer in a Pottery business.

The father, Carl Yocke, died on July 21, 1916. He is buried at Mt. Wood Cemetery, Wheeling, in the same plot as Margaret and Eddie.

When George registered for the World War I Draft, he was residing in Saint Clairsville, Ohio, and was employed by Wheeling Electric. Charles Yockey, father, 444 Coal Street, Wheeling, was the emergency contact when George shipped out on June 18, 1918 from New York. His father was deceased, so the this was his brother, not his father.
