

ISAAC S. HARTLEY

**Company "I" 3rd W.Va. Infantry, Subsequently 6th W.Va. Cavalry
POW; died of illness at Andersonville, Ga.**

ISAAC S. HARTLEY (I 3 Inf/6 WV Cav) - Service Record: "Died at Andersonville, Ga. Aug. 12, 1864 by reason of Dysentery while prisoner of war." At age 23, joined for duty and enrolled July 6, 1861 at Camp Hewes near Clarksburg, Harrison County, W.Va. Mustered in at Camp Hewes on July 10, 1861.

Records of the West Virginia Adjutant General: "At age 23, enlisted at Clarksburg and mustered in July 10, 1861 at Clarksburg, Harrison County, W.Va. Farmer, born in Washington County, Pa. Captured near Covington, Va., Dec. 19, 1863. Died Aug. 12, 1863." The original statement said, "A prisoner of war at date of muster out."

The image displays three historical military documents related to Isaac S. Hartley:

- Company Muster-in Roll:** A document from the 6th Cavalry, W. Va., listing Isaac Hartley as a Private in Capt. Purdy's Co., Western Virginia Vols. He is 23 years old and was mustered in on July 10, 1861, at Clarksburg. He joined for duty on July 6, 1861, at Camp Hewes near Clarksburg. The period of service is listed as 3 years. A bounty of \$100 was paid, and another \$100 is due. The document is signed by W. H. Scott, Adjutant.
- CASUALTY SHEET:** A document titled "CASUALTY SHEET" for Isaac Hartley, Private in Company I, 6th Regt. W. Va. Cavalry. It states he died at Andersonville, Ga. on August 12, 1864. The nature of the casualty is "Death".
- War Department Receipt:** A document from the War Department, A.G.O., dated Nov. 11, 1864. It is accepted as referring to Isaac S. Hartley, Private, Co. I, 6th Regt. West Virginia Cavalry (formerly 3rd Regt. West Virginia Infantry). It is signed by James H. [unclear], Sect. Adjt. Genl.

Isaac, found in the 1850 & 1860 census records of Clarksburg, Harrison County, was the son of James Hartley, a shoemaker, and Ann. Siblings were Agnes, Hannah, and William in 1850 & 1860. - The 1850 census says he was born in Virginia, but 1860 says Pennsylvania. He was 22 in 1860.

Both parents, James and Ann Hartley, applied for and received pensions in 1867. Ann died in Shinnston, Harrison County, on February 21, 1876. Ann's death record names her parents as Isaac and Rachel Stanley/Standley; the soldier was evidently named after her father.
